## 5. Mayor's Report

Mayor Jones stated that the Christmas Displays and Light Show were spectacular and thanked Kenneth Peters and his staff for all of their work on that project. The Christmas parade and concerts held at the Civic Center were successful as well. The school presented the Nutcracker at the PAC and several members of city staff participated in that program. The Leadership Wagoner classes are going well. The class held in December featured guest speaker Jay Hanna who presented the "Road to Abilene" program to the class. The class also began working on their community service project selection at the meeting. Mayor Jones is working on getting Mr. Hanna to present the program to City staff and that date and time will be determined and announced at a later date. Mayor Jones will be presenting his "State of the City" message at the next Council meeting. Discussions with INCOG and ODOT on the RAISE Grant project are ongoing and it looks favorable that ODOT will be the project manager on this grant.

The MLK Celebration will be held on January 19, 2023 at United Church in Wagoner. The parade will begin at 10:30 and go to the downtown area. The remaining events will be held at United Church.

Mr. Schilling asked what those numbers would be at a 3% increase which is what the employees received this fiscal year.

Jimmy Leopard presented the hospital report. Mr. Leopard introduced Dr. Randall Allison to the Council. Dr. Allison is the new Orthopedic Surgeon at the hospital. Dr. Allison addressed the Council.

Dwayne told the Council that December was a busy month as usual. The Streetscape Project should be wrapping up soon and the Stormwater Project is moving along. We received lots of positive comments on the Christmas displays and have several people requesting displays for next year. The Library and Wagoner Schools have an agreement on an EBook program which will make the library ebooks available to students at Wagoner Schools. The school will be putting in funding to be added to City funding to increase the books available.
